BUSING

Boys/Girls:

Shirts: School color Polo's* with OMS logo (approved vendors on school website).

Pants: Navy blue, black or khaki uniform pants (denim is not permitted). Pants should be worn

at natural waist, no sagging. Girls only, capri length is acceptable. NO YOGA/tight fitting stretchy bottoms or sweatpants with or without pockets or belt loops is acceptable.

NO Lycra or Spandex.

Shorts: Navy blue, black or khaki uniform/cargo shorts (denim is not permitted). Pants should be

worn at natural waist, no sagging. Girls only, navy blue, black or khaki uniform skorts. The hem of shorts/skorts MUST be at or longer than fingertip length when the child's

arms are extended straight by her side. Skirts are NOT acceptable.

Shoes: Closed-toed shoes, preferably sneakers. No boots or slippers.

Belts: Must be worn at the waist.

Jackets/Outerwear:

<u>Health:</u> Health Education is a semester course designed to enhance the awareness and knowledge of making healthy lifestyle choices. It is based on the wellness approach, which integrates social, mental, emotional, and physical health, along with learning life skills, in order to promote a positive and healthy lifestyle for each individual.

<u>TV Production</u>: Students learn basic understanding of field production equipment and editing software as they work on video projects. Students also learn project planning and research skills all while writing scripts for their projects. Oasis Middle's video production students have won dozens of awards at the District Level for their productions. This class is offered for various grade levels. The classroom is equipped with iMacs and Canon cameras.

Art: The goals of the art education program at Oasis Middle School are for students to explore art through a variety of media including, painting, drawing, printmaking, collage and sculpture; to learn about famous artists and their works; to apply aesthetic judgment when viewing art; to exhibit visual expression of their ideas throughout the school and community; to know the Elements of Art and how a composition is affected by applying them through the Principles of Design; to maintain a sketchbook and portfolio of their work.

Creativity, originality, neatness, design, and expression are encouraged in all works of art.

<u>Drama/Exploring Musical Theater:</u> Explore many forms of performing arts that include: Acting, Singing, Choreography, and Theater Production (stage make-up, scenery, lighting, etc. We will also have extra-curricular Musical, Chorus, and Jr. Thespians!!

Engineering: Students work with the engineering design process to solve a multitude of design challenges. This is a very hands-on program that combines project-based learning with real-world problem solving.

<u>Leadership & Character Education:</u> It aims to teach each of the 18 desired character traits in week long modules. Students will be exposed to real life models of character and leadership and learn how they can be leaders and role models in their own lives. The course reaches Florida standards for both ELA and Social studies.
