Solar Eclipse Viewing Permission Slip

On August 21, 2017, all students at Oasis Middle will be experiencing the solar eclipse. Our science teachers have ordered approved “glasses”, and have developed a schedule which will allow all students the opportunity to safely experience this solar eclipse. Many of our classes will also be watching the eclipse on various websites.

Watching a solar eclipse and looking directly at the Sun can be extremely dangerous to one’s eyes. All of our students are being taught how to view the eclipse in the safest way possible, through the use of approved “glasses”.
