


## The Details

- ◇ Student hours are 7:40 a.m. - 2:20 p.m.
- ◇ Students have 7 periods in their schedule. Students see each teacher every day, for 50 minutes each period.
- ◇ Uniforms are required. The full dress code policy can be found on our website - [www.oasismiddleschool.net](http://www.oasismiddleschool.net)
- ◇ Our top priority is ensuring students are educated in a safe, secure environment. Our administrative team (principal, assistant principal, dean of students, school counselor) work with our school resource officer to provide this for all students.
- ◇ A full time Cape Coral Police Officer is stationed on our campus, serving as our School Resource Officer (SRO).
- ◇ All families are required to volunteer a minimum of 12 hours each school year.
- ◇ A fee-based after school program is available to students from 2:20-4:20 p.m. The cost of this program is \$15 per week.
- ◇ Many teachers provide after school tutoring for students.
- ◇ We put kids first—always making decisions based on what is best for students.
- ◇ We set high expectations for students and staff. All classes at OMS are “Advanced” - appropriate rigor and
- ◇ We communicate consistently with parents/guardians, using Schoology and Focus.

## Academics

The Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) is the State’s standardized test which is administered to all students for language arts and math in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. The Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) Science is administered to all 8th grade students.



While a significant number of our students have met the expectations for English Language Arts (reading and writing combined), Math, Civics, and Science, there is still work to be done to ensure ALL students are showing academic progress here at OMS.

Students who are gifted receive services through Gifted and Talented Education (GATE). STEM is a year-long component of GATE. For our students who are struggling academically, they may have intensive reading or math.

When it comes to homework, math is the only subject permitted to assign nightly homework.
